
Pakistan Coronavirus CivActs Campaign



The Accountability Lab Pakistan (ALP), with the financial support of the European Union and technical support from The Asia Foundation (TAF) Pakistan and the Department of Health, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, has officially launched the Coronavirus CivActs Campaign (CCC) under the project 'Strengthening Community Resilience to COVID-19'. This campaign debunks rumours, fake news and misinformation related to COVID-19, conducts fact-checking, synthesizes data, and produces weekly bulletins for mass awareness. This includes important government decisions and vaccination drives, community feedback and concerns, and other questions from the ground around health and other COVID-19 related issues. The goal is to increase awareness among the most vulnerable groups in Pakistan (including but not limited to ethnic and religious minorities, transgender persons, persons with disabilities) and other marginalized communities with a focus on Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh. These bulletins are translated and disseminated in Urdu and other regional languages such as Pashto (audio version only) & Sindhi to reach far and wide to help citizens build resilience and fight against the pandemic. The bulletins are also shared with a range of stakeholders from the general public, to government departments, donors, CSOs and humanitarian networks via online and offline means.

Myths vs Facts



Misinformation has been spreading over social media that Pakistan has no more stocks of any vaccine available. This is untrue and should not be taken seriously. Pakistan currently has imported stocks of 5 vaccines: Chinese made CanSino, SinoPharm and SinoVac, UK made AstraZeneca and German-American made Pfizer. Pakistan also has the PakVac, which is its own manufactured vaccine being produced locally. In order to receive authentic information about the state of vaccination in Pakistan, please ensure that you are visiting official government websites and credible sources on social media such as Facebook and Whatsapp for information. In the case of any queries, please contact relevant authorities and do not post about matters which have not been confirmed by relevant bodies.

Exposure to extremely warm temperatures does not reduce the level of transmission for COVID. The coronavirus is not 'killed' or weakened due to exposure under the sunlight either. Hence, being outside under the sun for a long period of time will not reduce your chances of being infected by the coronavirus. This will inreturn cause heat-stroke or nose bleeds and other heat-exposure related illnesses. Additionally, heat exposure will not treat a case of coronavirus or reduce the severity of symptoms, so treatment should only be sought from a medical specialist. It does not mean that people can stop adhering to SOPs and be active in public gatherings just because it is warm outside. For summers right now, it is not advised to selfexperiment such theories and people should strictly implement all precautionary methods.

COVID Restrictions further eased in Sindh.

After seeing a decline in COVID positive cases and deaths, the Sindh government has decided to allow previously closed public spaces to reopen. Shrines, gymnasiums, amusement parks and other public areas can now have daily visitors with time limits in some places and strict following of SOPs in all of them. It is mandatory that all entrances have masks and sanitizers made available, for staff and visitors to adhere to SOPs at all times. These changes were announced after Sindh had seen an extended lockdown, which the Prime Minister, Imran Khan, had authorized on the request of the Sindh Minister.




Vaccination made obligatory for local KP government officials.

As a method to encourage vaccination in KPs public, it has been made mandatory for government officials to be vaccinated. In the guidelines, it has also been stated that they must vaccinate their families as well. KP has seen the highest amount of vaccine hesitancy and as a result initially had low statistics for inoculation, however as the vaccination process picked up speed throughout Pakistan, KP followed suit. Official vaccination certificates, which are issued on the NIMS NADRA website, are to be submitted for all members of the family and the officials themselves.

COVID flight restrictions to be lifted July 1st onwards.

With Pakistan's COVID positivity rate at 2.05%, the government has decided to lift a few restrictions on incoming international flights. Travel from all countries of Europe, Canada, China and Malaysia has been opened. However, they will not be functioning on full schedules, and rapid antigen testing will be used to determine individuals that would be needing quarantine. The document has been released by the NCOC and compliments other documents which are still in use for precautions and limitations of travel to Pakistan. The current flight schedule load stands at 20% from any country, except for those which are currently prohibited, and will be increased to 40% post July 1st.



Warning for 4th Wave expected in July.

According to the Artificial Intelligence modelling being used to predict the spread of COVID, Pakistan could be expecting a fourth wave within the month of July. Asad Umar, Chief NCOC, has expressed great concern over the adherence to SOPs and attitude of the public towards vaccination. In order to keep steady the progress that Pakistan has had, it is vital for everyone to understand how negligent behaviour will be impacting the efforts that have been made. Pakistan successfully stands at under 1000 positive COVID cases per day for two weeks straight now, which is a first after 8 months of high case numbers.
