



The Accountability Lab Pakistan (ALP), with the financial support of the European Union and technical support from The Asia Foundation (TAF) Pakistan and the Department of Health, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, has officially launched the Coronavirus CivActs Campaign (CCC) under the project 'Strengthening Community Resilience to COVID-19'. This campaign debunks rumours, fake news and misinformation related to COVID-19, conducts fact-checking, synthesizes data, and produces weekly bulletins for mass awareness. This includes important government decisions and vaccination drives, community feedback and concerns, and other questions from the ground around health and other COVID-19 related issues. The goal is to increase awareness among the most vulnerable groups in Pakistan (including but not limited to ethnic and religious minorities, transgender persons, persons with disabilities) and other marginalized communities with a focus on Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh. These bulletins are translated and disseminated in Urdu and other regional languages such as Pashto (audio version only) & Sindhi to reach far and wide to help citizens build resilience and fight against the pandemic. The bulletins are also shared with a range of stakeholders from the general public, to government departments, donors, CSOs and humanitarian networks via online and offline means.





This is false. Putting N95 masks in the sunlight can damage them. Similarly rubbing diesel or petrol also weakens the surface. It is understandable that people would want to reuse equipment as demand for PPE is increasing. However, these practices do more harm than good. Instead, there are some better and safer ways for preserving masks. Cloth masks should be washed and dried at high temperatures. On the other hand, N95 masks should be stored in a separate paper bag for 72 hours. Incase of any wear and tear, it is best to discard the masks. On the basis of available information, there is a low chance of humans getting the virus from cattle or animals in general. There is no evidence yet and more research is needed. However there have been cases where animals have got COVID-19 from infected people. Even though there has been no report of infected cattle, cattle owners should still be vigilant. Any person who is infected with COVID-19 should avoid getting in contact with animals, till we hear more on this possibility.

#### App introduced to catch fake COVID-19 certificates

NCOC and NADRA have launched an app called "Pak COVID-19 Vaccination Pass App." Through this app, vaccinated citizens can download and save vaccination certificates. It also consists of QR code to verify certificates on spot. This measure taken by the authorities is appreciable as it will discourage cases of fake certifications. This has also made it easier for vaccinated citizens to avail access to air travel and public areas, most of which will be denying access to unvaccinated people.



#### Travel through train would be banned for unvaccinated citizens from Oct 1 onwards



The decision came while discussing increasing cases in Peshawar and Rawalpindi. #### **KP positivity rate crosses 7%**

The COVID-19 situation in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa looks grim. The positivity rate has reached 7.1 %, when just two days ago it was 4.5 %. This is not taken lightly with Upper Chitral having the highest spot with a 30% positivity rate.

This should not be taken lightly since we are battling Delta variant which is a more severe variant than the original one. Public should strictly adhere to SOPs and wear masks. Public gatherings should be avoided at all costs. Infact Young Doctors Association has requested the KP government to put a 14-day complete lockdown. This is because almost all isolation wards are full. Therefore, it is important that the public does not panic and work with the authorities in bringing COVID situation in KP under control.

# \$500 million loan approved by Asian Development Bank for Pakistan to procure COVID-19 vaccines.


Under its Asia Pacific Vaccine Access Facility (APVACX), ADB is giving a loan of \$500 million to Pakistan. This will help Pakistan to purchase COVID-19 vaccines and improve its vaccination program. Through this project, Pakistan will receive help in procuring an estimated 39.8 million doses of vaccine, some syringes as well as safety boxes. Moreover, it will help finance the government's initial goal of vaccinating over 18 million Pakistanis. These measures will help the country in hindering rising infection rates.

# Authorities put up the first drive-through covid vaccination centre in Rawalpindi.

A drive through covid vaccination centre has been inaugurated in Rawalpindi. Residents can easily avail this facility if they want to avoid the hassle of long queues and procedures at vaccination centres. The facility has been set up at Allama Iqbal Park, Benazir Bhutto Road. This measure will speed up mass vaccination of the Rawalpindi public. Currently, 3 million people reside in Rawalpindi district aged 18 or above. Out of these, only 1.5 million have been inoculated.
