
Pakistan Coronavirus CivActs Campaign



The Accountability Lab Pakistan (ALP), with the financial support of the European Union and technical support from The Asia Foundation (TAF) Pakistan and the Department of Health, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, has officially launched the Coronavirus CivActs Campaign (CCC) under the project 'Strengthening Community Resilience to COVID-19'. This campaign debunks rumours, fake news and misinformation related to COVID-19, conducts fact-checking, synthesizes data, and produces weekly bulletins for mass awareness. This includes important government decisions and vaccination drives, community feedback and concerns, and other questions from the ground around health and other COVID-19 related issues. The goal is to increase awareness among the most vulnerable groups in Pakistan (including but not limited to ethnic and religious minorities, transgender persons, persons with disabilities) and other marginalized communities with a focus on Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh. These bulletins are translated and disseminated in Urdu and other regional languages such as Pashto (audio version only) & Sindhi to reach far and wide to help citizens build resilience and fight against the pandemic. The bulletins are also shared with a range of stakeholders from the general public, to government departments, donors, CSOs and humanitarian networks via online and offline means.



Vaccine hesitancy observed in transgender community

COVID -19 has affected every aspect of our life. The effect has specially struck the marginalised communities amongst us. Transgender community is one of them who feel overwhelmed more than ever. In efforts by the government to eradicate vaccine hesitancy, the trans community has gone unnoticed. Most members feel reluctant to get the vaccine, one of the reasons being fear of discrimination. Most of these centres have queues for just two genders therefore it is understandable that they might feel overwhelmed. Secondly, there have been a handful of instances where they have been humiliated and told to step out of lines. This makes them more anxious to get vaccinated. Moreover, most of the trans community suffers from controversial diseases due to poverty and lack of resources. Many of these members are under the impression that COVID vaccine will cause side effects when taken with their usual medication. This is incorrect. In fact, many medical specialists of serious diseases like HIV are confident that COVID-19 causes no dangerous side effects. Therefore, the government should set up mobile vaccination camps near the localities of members of the trans community while the general public should encourage and accommodate them to get inoculated.

KP reports 18 new deaths,770 new cases

COVID-19 situation in KPK is alarming. Last week, about 770 new cases of the virus were reported in just a single day. The same day 18 people died from the virus. As a result, the total deaths in the province increased to 4714, while overall cases reached 154,606. On a positive note, almost 742 people recovered from COVID-19 on the same day. It should be noted that these were probably the people who got vaccinated against the virus. Therefore, members of the general public who have not gotten themselves inoculated should do so, as soon as possible.

Experts warn pregnant women to get vaccinated against Covid-19

Top medical experts of the countries have highly encouraged pregnant and lactating women to get vaccinated against COVID-19 as soon as possible. The emphasis comes after the unfortunate passing away of a young dentist who was expecting. Just like any pregnant women, the patient was reluctant to get inoculated and as a result the mother and the unborn baby could not survive the complications due to COVID-19. This incident has shed light on the importance of pregnant and lactating women getting vaccinated. In fact, some top medical experts were also consulted in this regard.

According to a scientist at a UK university, pregnant women should first consult their physicians for weighing out the risks and benefits based on medical history. Afterwards, they should check the detailed guidelines on the website of the Ministry of National Health Services. Next, keeping guidelines in mind, they should try to get vaccinated with either Pfizer or Moderna's vaccine. This way not only pregnant women will be safe, but later on the baby will go on to have some natural immunity against the virus. Infact, pregnant women with COVID-19 are three times more likely to be on a ventilator and die than other pregnant women. Moreover, newborns of infected mothers are five times more likely to go to ICU. Hence, it is the responsibility of all male and female members of a household to ensure that pregnant and lactating women get vaccinated as soon as possible.


Sindh decides to open Educational institutes from August 30th

The Sindh government on 23rd of August announced that all such public and private schools that have all of their staff vaccinated, will open. Amidst all the confusion, it was finally decided to open schools from 30th August. Initially it had been decided to close schools until further notice. However, the authorities changed the directive the very same day, after meeting with representatives of private schools.

According to the new notification, schools with 100 percent vaccinated staff will open 50 percent attendance. Additionally, school management will check vaccination cards of parents. In conclusion, parents in Sindh should get themselves vaccinated and get their vaccinated cards ready before 30th August.
