



The Accountability Lab Pakistan (ALP), with the financial support of the European Union and technical support from The Asia Foundation (TAF) Pakistan and the Department of Health, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, has officially launched the Coronavirus CivActs Campaign (CCC) under the project 'Strengthening Community Resilience to COVID-19'. This campaign debunks rumours, fake news and misinformation related to COVID-19, conducts fact-checking, synthesizes data, and produces weekly bulletins for mass awareness. This includes important government decisions and vaccination drives, community feedback and concerns, and other questions from the ground around health and other COVID-19 related issues. The goal is to increase awareness among the most vulnerable groups in Pakistan (including but not limited to ethnic and religious minorities, transgender persons, persons with disabilities) and other marginalized communities with a focus on Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Sindh. These bulletins are translated and disseminated in Urdu and other regional languages such as Pashto (audio version only) & Sindhi to reach far and wide to help citizens build resilience and fight against the pandemic. The bulletins are also shared with a range of stakeholders from the general public, to government departments, donors, CSOs and humanitarian networks via online and offline means.





This is incorrect. More strains are expected to come. Lately NCOC has announced that eligible citizens can get the booster COVID-19 vaccine shots on payment. According to the recent notification, the specific dose will be administered to 12 years and older international travellers who are travelling to a destination where it is mandatorily required. These may include students, workers, Pakistanis who are residents abroad, business travellers, tourists and Haj/Umrah pilgrims. Most importantly, all these travellers will have to show proof of travel and submit copies of valid travel documents at designated vaccination centres. It is important to remember that weather and climate is just one of the many factors. This means we should still be careful on sunny and dry days

Sindh suggested making vaccination compulsory for banking purposes.

Sindh asked the country's top health authorities to make it compulsory for citizens to show their vaccination certificates at banks and post offices. The request was suggested, to be not only implemented in Sindh but all over the country. It should be noted that if the suggestion is accepted, then banking and post office services will be refused to all unvaccinated people and vaccinated citizens who lack a vaccination certificate .Therefore the general public is advised to not wait and get their vaccination certificates as soon as possible.

More than 60 million vaccine shots administered by Pakistan

The National Command and Operation Centre (NCOC) declared the administration of 60 million vaccine shots by Pakistan. In fact, over a million doses were administered in a single day of that week. This is good news since the government had set a benchmark of vaccinating 70 million Pakistanis by December. However we still have a long way to go because the positivity rate was 6.21% at that time. Moreover the percentage of Pakistan's population that is fully vaccinated, is just over 13% so far. Not until the whole population gets vaccinated, we cannot bring our positivity rate of COVID-19 down and, eventually prevent deaths from future COVID-19 variants. Source: Brecorder

COMMON SIDE EFFECTS AFTER COV D-19 VACCINATION







Peshawar, Swabi and Haripur among several districts imposed with fresh travel restrictions.

The KP government decided to suspend inter-city public transport in districts including Peshawar, Swabi, Malakand ,Swat, Haripur, Abbottabad, Mansehra and D.I Khan.This announcement came as one of the measures to control COVID-19 in these districts where coronavirus rates were high.The ban was imposed with effect from 3rd September and will go on until midnight of 12th September. Moreover, public transport intended to the above-mentioned districts was also banned by the neighbouring districts. The only vehicles that were excused from the ban were private vehicles, freight transport and transport meant for medical services.



Over 3600 new COVID-19 cases registered within a day

Just in a single day, almost 3221 people were reported to have gotten COVID-19. This is alarming. Yet it was the fourth consecutive day when daily COVID-19 cases were below 4000. This was mainly because of all the people who got themselves vaccinated and the penalties by the government that prompted this action. Moreover, over three thousand COVID-19 patients recovered from the disease taking the number of active cases to 92,367.

Only about over 13% of our population is fully vaccinated so far. This is very low according to international standards. Therefore, we all need to make sure that every member of our community is vaccinated because no one is safe until all are safe.
