COVID-19 Stats for Liberia




212 confirmed cases

- 50% of all confirmed cases are so far active
- 41% of all confirmed cases have so far recovered
- 9% of all confirmed cases have so far died

Questions → Facts



How long does it take for a patient to completely heal from coronavirus? Is there a specific recovery period?

According to the World Health Organization, recovering from coronavirus depends on the nature of the patient's case or immune system. For people with mild symptoms, recovery time is about two weeks, while people with severe or critical symptoms recover within three to six weeks.



Which people are among a patient's coronavirus contacts? How do you know that you have been placed on a potential contact list?

Coronavirus contacts include a list of persons who have interacted with a confirmed patient. In many cases, it is the role of the patient to generate this list, by giving the health workers information about everyone they interacted with during their incubation period. Once a person has been placed on the NPHIL's potential contact list, contact tracers will immediately go into the community to track down concerned individuals and inform them about their status as possible contacts to a positive case.



Where can I go to get tested for coronavirus? How many testing centers are there in Liberia?

The National Public Health Institution (NPHIL) is the only organization responsible for collecting specimens (or samples) for clinical testing on people that might have displayed symptoms of the coronavirus.

There is just one testing center in the entire country. Specimens collected across the country are flown to the National Public Health Reference Laboratory (NPHRL) in Margibi. Live patients and death cases are tested at the NPHRL.



Follow these steps to help prevent the spread of coronavirus

- Stay at home unless you provide an essential service.
- Keep washing your hands frequently with soap for a minimum of 20 seconds. Use hand sanitizer (with at least 60% alcohol) if soap and water are not available.
- Cover your nose and mouth (with your elbow or a tissue) when sneezing.
- Avoid crowded places and practice physical distancing. If you think you have been exposed to someone with coronavirus, quarantine yourself for a minimum of 14 days and monitor any symptoms.
- The Center for Disease Control (CDC) has confirmed six new possible coronavirus symptoms. They are chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headaches, a sore throat,
- new loss of taste and smell. The original reported symptoms remain fever, tiredness and a dry cough.
